This Epiphany, Look for the Light

The season between Christmas and Lent is known as the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is from the Greek *epipháneia* which means a manifestation or occurrence. It comes from the verb *phainein*, to appear. And that's quite frankly all the Greek etymology any newsletter article needs. The point is, Epiphany is the season in which we look for all the ways and places God is among us in the person of Jesus.

The theme for our worship this Epiphany season is taken from the song we will be singing as our Gospel Acclamation, The Light of Christ Has Come Into the World. At Christmas we heard how Jesus, the light of the world, became flesh and lived among us. Epiphany teaches us to see how the light of the world is still among us, in worship and song, in friendship and service, in the waters of baptism and the bread and wine of communion, and in the fellowship and support of the people of God.

There is a poem by Walter Brueggemann I have printed on the Take Home House Blessing sheets I have passed out most years. It's on there again this year, but it bears including here as well. The poem is called Epiphany.

Epiphany by Walter Brueggemann

On Epiphany day, we are still the people walking. We are still people in the dark, and the darkness looms large around us, beset as we are by fear, anxiety, brutality, violence, loss a dozen alienations that we cannot manage.

We are—we could be—people of your light. So we pray for the light of your glorious presence as we wait for your appearing; we pray for the light of your wondrous grace as we exhaust our coping capacity; we pray for your gift of newness that will override our weariness; we pray that we may see and know and hear and trust in your good rule.

That we may have energy, courage, and freedom to enact your rule through the demands of this day. We submit our day to you and to your rule, with deep joy and high hope.

Blessing for a Home at Epiphany

Matthew writes that when the magi saw the shining star stop overhead, they were filled with joy. "On entering the house, the saw the child with Mary his mother" (Matt. 2:10-11). In the home, Christ is met in family and friends, in visitors and strangers. In the home, faith is shared, nurtured, and put into action. In the home, Christ is welcome.

Epiphany offers an occasion for gathering with friends and family members for a blessing for the home. Following an eastern European tradition, a visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door; 20 + CMB + 22. The numbers change with each new year. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing *Christe mansionem benedicat*, which means "Christ, bless this house," or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

Greeting

May peace be to this house and to all who enter here. By wisdom a house is built and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures. (*Proverbs 24:3-4*)

Reading

As we prepare to ask God's blessing on this household, let us listen to the words of scripture.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people.

The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. (*John1:1-4. 14, 16*)

Free Learning Opportunity through the Synod

Beginning in winter 2023, our Synod (the North/West Lower Michigan Synod) of the ELCA will offer a series of six-week Zoom courses lead by seminary professors. These courses are open to everyone and are free of charge. The first class has, in Pastor Kjersten's opinion, a very seminary professor title, "Corinthian Correspondence: Conflict, Case Studies, Contemporary Congregations, and Christ," taught by the Rev. Dr. Walther F. Taylor, Jr., the Ernest W. and Edith S. Ogram Professor Emeritus of New Testament Studies, Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University. Don't let the title scare you, the class looks excellent! The goal of the study is to learn from Paul and his house churches in the ancient Greek city of Corinth—both how they fell into conflict and how Paul sought to move them to reconciliation and ministry. The class sessions will also focus on problems facing believers today, such as how to deal with divisions, how to live together positive ways, how to live as physical bodies, how to live in intimate relationships, who should lead congregations, including the roles of women and men, how believers can look beyond themselves, and what really is the resurrection and how does it affect life today?

Each session will be self-contained so even if you have to miss a week, you can still take part in later sessions. The class will meet on six consecutive Tuesday evenings: January 10, 17, 24, 31; February 7, 14, 2023 from 7:00 – 8:15pm ET.
