PASTOR'S LETTER

I may have shared at one point that my senior capstone paper in seminary was on the marks of the church, specifically what is it that distinguishes worship. It would be interesting to go back and revisit that paper now, because after two years of social distance worship, virtual worship, mask worship, outdoor worship, of laughing while candles won't stay lit on Christmas Eve in the snow, of Dugan (the cat) protesting my attempts at singing, of the feeling of community when thumbs up and hearts would pop across the Facebook Live feed on my phone, I've learned that worship, that God, happens, comes to us, in more ways than I'd ever thought possible. And I had a pretty broad understanding of how and where God could meet us to start with.

I've also learned that there is something that happens when we are together in a physical space. There is a moving of the Spirit when the people of God are together doing the work of worship (fun fact: liturgy, the fancy church word for the parts of the service, literally means "work of the people" in Greek).

Facebook worship is here to stay, and I am so grateful to live in a time where the technology is possible. I love still worshiping with our snowbirds, homebound members, and snowed-in members. I love that you don't have to feel left out or disconnected if you are home sick or out of town or snowed into your driveway or whatever. Facebook worship IS worship. Fully and completely, 100%. I experienced worship with you in my living room on my phone, in the sanctuary with my phone on a tripod, and every Sunday when I look up to the streaming camera and know you are on the other side. However, whenever, you join me in worship, we are in worship together.

And, also, I want to offer this invitation. If/when you are able, please come back to worship in the building. Not because Facebook worship isn't good worship, but because I miss you in worship, we miss you in worship. We worship together because we worship for each other. I think I've probably shared before that we say the creed and the Lord's prayer aloud together, because we say them for each other. When my voice is weak, my faith is doubting, you say the words for me, and vice versa. That is obviously true however and wherever we are, we say the creed with the whole church across time and space. But on any given Sunday, hearing another's voice when mine stumbles strengthens my faith.

A quick word about masks. We have continued to encourage mask wearing during worship because the council has heard feedback that with the coronavirus still circulating, the majority of Trinity members feel more comfortable wearing masks in worship. But while I know it is true for a lot of people, I also know it is not true for everyone. For people with asthma and other breathing problems, the masks are not comfortable and are in fact a hindrance to your worship. If you've been staying away because of you're concerned about having to mask for that long, know that you are welcome to take off your mask in worship if you need to. We're masking for the comfort of others, and if you can't breathe then you can't be comfortable, so you need to do what you need to do to breath.

And finally, a word for our homebound members. The greatest thing about Facebook Live is I know that some of you who have not been able to be in worship for a long time are able to attend regularly again. As we start

to come out of the pandemic, I am starting to get back into making regular visits to bring communion to you. I'm still working on establishing a schedule, and I need your help. If you would like a visit, please never hesitate to call me. If you know someone who needs or wants a visit, either encourage them to call me, or call and let me know.

In Matthew 18, Jesus said that "wherever two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." We have learned over these past two years that there are a LOT of ways to gather. However, we gather, there too is Christ. I am glad to worship with you, in all the ways we worship. Snowbirds, soak up some sun for me and travel back safe.

DA CAPO

The musical term, Da Capo, means to return to the beginning section of the music. Most musical terms come from the Italian language because Italy was a center of musical composition when composers were wanting more specific instructions included in the music as to how it would be performed. These Italian terms stuck and are now universal and have remained in use over the centuries. Da Capo literally translates to "from the head" (cap, top) of the piece. It's frequently abbreviated to D.C. We'll return to Da Capo in a minute.

I just read the play on which one of my very favorite movies was based. This is Horton Foote's The Trip to Bountiful. Foote is probably best known for his screenplay adaptation of Harper Lee's To Kill a Mockingbird in 1962. He also did an original screenplay for Tender Mercies in 1983. He also adapted John Steinbeck's Of Mice and Men in 1992. The Trip to Bountiful is the moving story of an aging woman, Carrie Watts, who desperately wants to return to her childhood small town where she has always remembered herself as perfectly happy. She now lives (trapped) in a 3-room apartment in 1940's Houston, Texas with her henpecked son and her controlling daughter-in-law and longs for a time past. It reminds me of Da Capo. She wants to go back to the beautiful house that has remained unaltered in the scrapbook of her wishfulness. Of course, it's a ghost of what it once was. But there is some joy in the act of returning, no matter what awaits her. It also makes me think of the discouraging stories of the uprooted people of Ukraine. And, again, the resilient spirit of hope is a defining characteristic of so many people we hear about in that sad situation.

In the 1985 film, Geraldine Page truly becomes Mrs. Watts. She simply talks, she truly listens, she sings her beloved hymns which give her comfort and help her soul struggle for inner peace. Yes, there is loneliness, loss, grief and fear but there is also a big dose of courage and love. It was exactly the story I needed to hear in our present world filled with some very heavy and dark themes.

Carrie Watts wonders what will still be left after they and the house are gone: the river, the fields, the trees, the smell of the Gulf. She tells her son, Ludie, that they are all part of the land that keeps changing. "That's what I always took my strength from, Ludie. Not from houses, not from people. It's so quiet. It's so eternally quiet. I had forgotten the peace. The quiet. And it's given me strength once more, Ludie. To go on and do what I have to do. I've found my dignity and my strength... We're part of all this. We left it, but we can never lose what it has given us." There is no shortage of spirit in the character of Carrie. This is also a play/film that shows all of the characters grow, change and learn to share through their dealings with each other. I highly recommend it — but have some tissues handy.

Electronics – camcorders, cameras, cellphones, computers, copiers, CRT monitors, DVD players, fax, hard drives, hubs, laptops, LCD displays, optical drives, pagers, PDAs, printers, radios, scanners, servers, stereos, switches, telephone systems, TVs, UPS systems, VCRs, video game systems, household batteries and car batteries, and wires and cables.

Scrap Metal – appliances (Freezers, refrigerators, AC units, dehumidifiers (refrigerant removal available), ovens, dishwashers, washers, and dryers) and scrap metal. Items containing refrigerant must be unloaded by 5:15 pm.

Events are for Calhoun County residents only and items must be residential. Please stay in your vehicle.

Accepted Items:

oil-based paint, fuels (in fuel cans), solvents, acids, bases, pesticides, household cleaners, mercury, medications, sharps (inside rigid puncture resistant container w/lid). weapons, explosive household batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, motor oil, oil smoke detectors) filters, antifreeze, propane cylinders, gas cylinders (NO foam insulation), fire extinguishers, aerosol cans, PCB and non-PCB lamp ballasts, oxidizers, self-heating solids construction/dem flammable solids/liquids, toxic inorganics/organics, lighters, chlorophenols, lead, self-defense spray, peroxides, water-reactives, isocyanates, cyanide lif you would like years.

NOT Accepted Items:

latex paint, school chemicals, biologically active material, home-use insulation spraying cylinders, ammunitions, weapons, explosives, radioactive material (includes smoke detectors)

HHW collections DO NOT include trash, tires, yard waste, construction/demolition waste, appliances, or industrial/business-generated waste. These items are not defined as household hazardous waste.
