Pastor's Letter

Dear Trinity,

We start every council meeting by asking the question, "Where have you seen God this week?" Each member of council goes around and shares a story of somewhere they saw God. Teresa's line this week cracked us all up. She remarked, "I've seen God all over the building this week. In the computer class, in the trainees, in the Monday social gatherings, I've seen God building people up, caring for people, smiting some people, just all over the building." I thought about Teresa's comment later on as I came back from dropping off coffee to a local elementary school (finishing the God's Work Our Hands project from a few weeks ago), and into the glorious chaos of a weekday at Trinity. At the far end of the hall, the sewing group was buzzing with creativity. The old Sunday school room is a classroom again, this time with people learning computer skills from KCC instructors. The Little Free clothing closet is full of coats for the winter. Will was in the sanctuary gathering music for Sunday. Janitors were everywhere, cleaning, straightening, sweeping, and doing other odd jobs. Everywhere I looked, I saw God at work in so many ways and through so many people.

October, as per our tradition, is the month we focus on stewardship. We're leading up to gathering intent cards on October 23rd. I want to talk a little bit about what this means, because we've changed up some of the language this year, I think for the better. If you've been around Trinity a few years, you are probably familiar with pledge cards, the cards where we write how much money we plan to contribute to the mission of the congregation over the course of the year. These cards are between you and God (and Doug Martens, but he tells no one. I've been here eight years and I'm the pastor, I've never seen anyone's pledge card). We have the practice of writing down this amount to help us recognize this act of giving as a spiritual discipline. All of that is the same this year. The reason we're calling them intent cards is because the word 'intent' better captures the purpose of this activity. This is what we intend to do. It doesn't mean it is what we will do. There may be a hardship that crops up in the year that causes the amount to lower, or maybe it's a banner year and you find yourself able to be more generous than you'd anticipated. Calling them Intent Cards helps capture the idea that this is a snapshot of a moment in time. It is also important for you to know/remember that even though stewardship season and budget season overlap, they happen independently of one another. By this point in time, the budget at Trinity is pretty well fixed, it is what things cost. We set the budget based on the cost of the ministries, and then figure out how to meet the budget. Our intent cards are part of that picture, as are grants, mission partners, and other gifts. I will be honest and tell you, this faith-based process of budgeting causes some gray hairs for your pastor and finance team. But creating a budget based on the work God has called us to, not the work we feel we can pay for, is what has allowed us for so many years to punch above our weight in terms of the incredible ministry that is able to come out of this tiny congregation. We are generous,

and creative, and God keeps doing amazing things with us. I'll know our ministry has come to an end when this system creating a budget based on need and trusting God will somehow meet it stops working. It hasn't vet.

Gloria, Diane, and I are taking this stewardship class called Building a Culture of Generosity. And first a disclaimer, it is a great class and I'm learning a lot. But there are some ways where I struggle with it because we already have a culture of generosity at Trinity. As I talked about last Sunday, you have taught me about how to be generous. So here's the challenge I want to offer to you this stewardship year. As you are considering how God is calling you to be generous with your finances this year, I want to challenge you to be generous with your inviting. What do I mean? We're coming out of a pandemic, and there are faces missing that used to be here, for a variety of reasons. I've been asked quite frequently of late, "where is so-and-so, how is so-and-so doing, I miss so-and-so." My challenge for you is, if there is someone you miss, someone you haven't seen in a while, someone you want to check in on, call them. Set up a time to visit with them. If they are able, invite them to worship with you. If they aren't able, help them set up Facebook Live if they don't already have it. This is harder than writing a check, I know, because it requires vulnerability and putting yourself out there. But trust me, if you are missing someone, they miss you too.
