Pastor's Letter

I'm taking part in the six-week Zoom class on the Small Catechism offered by the synod. The class, by the way, is excellent. It's too late for you to sign up for this one, but the synod offers one of these six-week Zoom classes a few times a year over a variety of subjects—for free—and they're excellent. I'll let you know when the next one is announced, and I'd certainly encourage you to take advantage of this great resource.

But anyway, on this one. We were talking about Luther's understanding of the Creeds, but the professor got off topic, as professors are wont to do, and she started talking about communion. Specifically, the words of communion. Throughout Luther's Small Catechism, Luther uses a lot of first-person personal pronouns. In the section on the First Article of the Creed: "I believe that God has created *me* together with all that exists. God has given *me* and still preserves *my* body and soul: eyes, ears, and all limbs and senses reason and mental faculties." Or the Second Article, "I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, because of the Father in eternity, and also a true human being, born of the virgin Mary, is *my* Lord. He has redeemed *me*... He has purchased and freed *me* from all sin... He has done all this in order that *I* may belong to him..."

The professor pointed this out to us, how Luther teaches the creed in a way to make it clear that the creed is not some vague overarching thing we say, but a declaration about what God has done in our lives. And then she got distracted and went on this tangent about the words we say as we distribute communion. "I supplied at an Episcopal church for a while," she said. "And when Episcopalians distribute communion, they say, 'the body of Christ, the bread of heaven' and 'the blood of Christ, the cup of salvation.' Which is both theologically true and beautifully poetic language. In Lutheran churches though, we say, 'The body of Christ, give for you, the blood of Christ, shed for you.' The emphasis is on that this is for you."

Then she said something that struck me. The point of this for you is to remind us that Christ died for us not as a collective but as who we are individually. "If you were the only person on earth, Christ would have still died for you."

Christ died for us. For all of us, yes, but also for each of us individually. We matter that much in the kingdom of God.
