#### The Pastor's Letter

#### **Explanation of the Reredos Painting**

Eileen, Mary, and Gloria have been hard at work sorting and organizing files in the church office. While organizing, they found this description of the mural that decorates our sanctuary.

The reredos painting is an expression of joy, and exultation of freedom, and a celebration of color. We hope you will find, first of all, that it excites your emotions and lifts your spirit. On closer inspection, you will see the Trinity symbols through the center, the circle representing the Father, the Chi Rho signifying the son, and the flame symbolizing the Holy Spirit. Then, on the left side, is a symbol of the Church – the ship – and on the right is a suggestion of the elements of the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion – water, bread, and wine from the field and lake. The painting was done by Dr. Richard Caemmerer of Valparaiso University.

Because I am who I am, finding the description, I did some additional research. Dr. Richard Caemmerer loved painting faith-themed art for his entire career. I found a story about how as an art student in the mid-60s, he annoyed one of his professors with his focus on religious art. "The professor threatened to fail Caemmerer in one art class unless he painted something non-Christian,' said Caemmerer's son, Michael. 'Dad responded by painting a lunch-counter scene from the Civil Rights movement.' Then

the professor took a second look, and 'saw there was one guy serving 12 guys, and he had just painted the last supper,' his son said. Still, it worked, and Richard Caemmerer passed the class, moving on to a lifetime of artand faith-infused work."


Earning a master's degree in art, Caemmerer went on to serve as Professor of Art at Valparaiso University from 1958-1980. At some point in this period, he painted the mural that adorns our sanctuary. His work also appears in 600 other churches throughout the United States, as well as in Canada, Central America, Germany, Africa, and Yugoslavia, representing all denominations. In addition to murals like ours, he also worked in stained glass, sculpture, fresco, sgraffito, and tapestry.

Following his retirement, he and his wife Elizabeth moved to a rural valley in the Cascade Mountains in Washington State, where they established the Grünewald Guild, an arts education nonprofit retreat center that is still in operation today. From the Guild's website: "At its core, the Guild a place of learning. People come to study their chosen area of art in the context of a community of artists. When they leave, they are charged with the work of returning to their homes and sharing what they have learned with their communities. This is straight from the artisan guilds tradition, stretching back into the depths of human history." The name comes from the 15th Century artist Matthias Grünewald, with specific reference to his Isenheim Altarpiece, a piece done for the Monastery of St. Anthony. The Antonine monks were known for their care for those suffering from the plague and other skin diseases. Reflecting their mission, Christ was depicted with plague-like sores, showing patients that Jesus understood and shared their suffering. Grünewald was a favorite of Caemmerer because he painted Jesus Christ as the god of all things. Said Caemmerer, Grünewald showed that, "all those things that caused him [God] pain, he withstood. And he can do it. And you can do it. Why? Because it's already been done."

#### RECIPE CORNER

#### Penne Mac and Cheese (German Style) – Laurie Swanson

Note: This recipe was created for a special Crock Pot that is shaped more like a 13 X 9 casserole dish. In other words, the food is fairly flat in the dish so it may cook more slowly in a regular Crockpot where food is in a thicker layer. The first time you use this recipe, you will need to add time and maybe stir the noodles a bit. Just watch time and sample noodles to be sure they're cooked. Make note of any change you make in cooking time for the next pot luck!

#### **Penne Mac and Cheese**

serves 8 - 10 (More as side dish)

**NOTE:** The optional garlic and onion are what makes this recipe create a German traditional dish **if you want.** 

#### Ingredients:

2 jars (15 - 16 ounces each) Alfredo pasta sauce (could be low fat)
2 cups milk
I package (16 ounces) uncooked penne pasta (I use mini penne)
3 cups (12 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese divided
Cooking spray or butter
1 white onion (optional)

#### Garlic Crumb Topping (recipe below) optional

2 cloves garlic- chopped small cooking spray butter

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Mix Alfredo sauce and milk in the biggest bowl you own. Stir in uncooked pasta and 2 cups cheese, & onions if using
- 2. Generously spray the slow cooker stoneware with cooking spray or butter and place ingredients in the pot.
- 3. Cover: cook on low for 3 4 hours or on high for 2 1/2 to 3 hours
- 4. Sprinkle top with remaining cheese. Let stand covered 5 minutes before serving. Add garlic crumb topping if using.

#### **Garlic Crumb Topping**

Toss 1 cup panko crumbs with 2 tablespoons melted butter and 1 clove minced garlic in a bowl.
